with Elective Studies in Religion

A Bachelor of Music with Elective Studies in Religion is a four-year music degree with a minor in religion. This degree is appropriate for students who plan careers as church musicians or music ministers.

Degree coursework enables students to be successful musicians. In addition to university core requirements, students take applied music, as well as coursework in music history, theory and conducting. Students gain performance experience in marching band, wind ensemble, jazz band, orchestra, choir and opera, in addition to small ensemble and solo performance opportunities. Students must also complete a religion minor as outlined by the Department of Religious Studies.

Admission Requirements

To pursue a Bachelor of Music with Elective Studies in Religion, students must:

- Apply and be admitted to the University of Houston as a freshman or undergraduate transfer student. International students must have a minimum score of 550 on the paper-based TOEFL or 79 on the internet-based TOEFL.
- Apply separately to the Moores School of Music and complete a successful audition. The music school application is available at www.music.uh.edu. Please note that music school application deadlines may differ from those of the university. All applicants must audition on a major instrument.
